Graduation Requirements

Forty-seven (47) credits are required for graduation. A student must have a course in Theology for each year of attendance at Andean as well as Word Processing/IBM Computer Applications. In addition, students must meet the State of Indiana graduation requirements, which include the following:

A plus (+) or minus (-) is an indicator for parents. They are not used to determine Grade Point Average (G.P.A.)

Grade reports are issued every nine weeks. Class rank is based upon semester grades (18 weeks) and class rank is computed each semester. The student's G.P.A. is determined by dividing their accumulated quality points by their accumulated credits attempted. All the students in the class are ranked from highest G.P.A. to the lowest. Andean uses a 4.0 scale.

All A's qualifies a student for Andean Society. A G.P.A. of 4.0 qualifies a student for the A Honor Roll and a G.P.A. of 3.0 or above qualifies a student for the B Honor Roll.

Curriculum/Marking System

Andean High School offers **15** Honors Courses and **11** Advanced Placement Courses. Curriculum at Andean is divided into two types of courses: AP/Honors and Regular.

The following quality point system is used to determine class rank for AP/Honors Courses:
